



LGBTQ Clinical Fellowship

Through this unique, competitive program, fellows gain advanced clinical expertise in working with LGBTQ people. The LGBTQ Clinical Fellow will provide psychotherapy services to LGBTQ individuals, couples, and groups, and participate in intensive clinical supervision, continued education and training opportunities.

Duties:

- Provides psychotherapy services to a caseload of 20, including individuals and couples; maintains case notes, treatment plans, and other documentation.
- Provides LGBTQ group therapy.
- Participates in weekly individual and group clinical supervision, administrative meetings, and other relevant meetings.
- Attends bi-weekly clinical training modules to develop skills and knowledge in working specifically with LGBTQ population.
- Assists division coordinator in creation and implementation of Gender & Sexuality workshops and seminars for mental health professionals.
- Availability to work some evenings until 10PM. Possibility to substitute evening hours for weekend shift.

Required Qualifications:

- Graduate degree in social work or mental health counseling (LMSW, MHC-LP)
- Experience working with LGBTQ populations.
- Assessment, treatment planning, and psychotherapy experience.
- Excellent written and spoken communication skills.

Compensation:

Yearly stipend of \$23,000, including health benefits and free supervision.

Commitment:

2 years, approximately 25 hours per week.

Candidates from such groups, such as people of color and LGBTQ people, who meet the minimum application requirements are strongly encouraged to apply.
